THE CITIES WE NEED FOR THE OCEAN WE WANT

(Co-organised with IOC-UNESCO and EuroGOOS)

This workshop will discuss ocean literacy as a tool to connect ocean science with cities and communities in European coastal or land-locked settings. We will engage with ocean literacy practitioners, oceanographers, city authorities, and the next generation of Blue Career professionals, to discuss how to make our cities more blue and citizens more ocean literate. With the UN Decade of Ocean Science going on full steam, we will invite the audience to follow the Decade programme “Ocean Literacy With All” and its project “Scientists for Ocean Literacy”. Students from the Bologna University will share their ideas and expectations from the city municipalities and representatives of the ocean literacy initiatives across Europe. The event will connect science with the public in a tangible way to co-design tools and solutions for the cities we need for the ocean we want.

PARALLEL WORKSHOP 4
FROM INDIVIDUAL TO COLLECTIVE ACTION: THE ROLE FOR SEA BASIN INITIATIVES TO
STRENGTHEN OCEAN LITERACY IN EUROPE

(Co-organized with Regione Emilia-Romagna and ACTeon)

The workshop builds on experiences from different actors involved in ocean literacy (OL) activities at different territorial scales, identifying common lessons in terms of bottlenecks and conditions for success. In light of these experiences, it then investigates the role sea basin initiatives could have in providing the right umbrella and conditions in the different European seas to steer and facilitate the replication and upscaling of OL initiatives. Lessons will help defining efforts and activities at the sea basin scale to be organised within the frame of the EU4Ocean coalition.
